Karissa Cook, our shelter manager, suggested holding a kitten shower at MWHS as a fun way to get donations of much-needed kitten food and supplies, and to sign up new fosters before the start of kitten season. The price of admission would be an item from our kitten supplies wish list. So, Karissa and Foster Coordinator Maria Balzarini immediately began planning and preparing for the kitten shower before the pitter patter of tiny paws caught up with us.

An invitation was sent out to friends of MWHS, posted on Facebook, and advertised on many community bulletin boards in the area. The Kitten Shower soon became the talk of the town! MWHS volunteers provided yummy homemade cookies and cupcakes for the bake sale, two beautiful baskets as raffle prizes, pink and blue decorations, and a delectable "Welcome Kittens" cake.

On Saturday morning, we decorated the shelter and set up a playpen to hold all the donations. Playpens were also set up in the office for the stars of the shower – two litters of adorable foster kittens! At noon, the doors opened...and guests bearing gifts streamed in. For the rest of the day, people came by to drop off donations, buy baked goods, sign up for the raffles, and, of course, see the kittens. All afternoon, the office was filled with smiling people, young and old, holding and playing with the kittens. By the end of the day, six wonderful families had signed up to be fosters, Karissa and Maria were still standing, and the kittens were fast asleep in the arms of our guests! A Letter from the President

Summer is upon us! While many of us are getting ready for relaxing summer vacations, all of us at MWHS are gearing up for one of our busiest seasons. Kittens are arriving by the litter, and as always, our trapping projects never stop. Additionally, we have taken in dozens of surrenders already this summer, either from local animal hospitals, or from owners who can no longer take care of their pet. Many of these surrenders come to us in need of lots of medical care, which forces owners to surrender or euthanize their cats should they be unable to pay the high medical bills. MWHS has and always will respond to the call.

One such situation came to us from a local trapping site. One of our volunteers received a call that there were two injured cats that needed to be trapped as soon as possible. While both cats were injured, one in




particular needed emergent veterinary care. He was taken to Boston West, and was discovered to have a severe infection in wounds on one of his front legs, a necrotic tail, and an extremely high fever of 105 degrees. He was too sick for immediate surgery, so we had to wait and hope that antibiotics and fluids would get him through the night, and get him stable enough to have his leg and part of his tail amputated. It was clear that this cat had been attacked by a large animal while outside, and just barely made it away with his life.

Fortunately, there is a happy ending. This cat, now known as Brody, survived his wounds and surgeries, and is now in foster care. However, these events further prove just how dangerous life is for a cat who goes outdoors. Even though the beautiful summer weather may seem like a perfect time to let your cat explore your backyard, stories like Brody's further stress our belief of an indoor-only life for your cat.

The Inn has all the amenities that we would want for our cats — lots of windows, carpeted perches, soft beds, cat trees, and cat doors that open up into a huge enclosed catio space with ramps, perches, fresh catnip plants, and tree branches to climb on (see photo of Patty Sanclemente and Jen Vickery in front of the Black Cat Inn). And best of all, beautiful views of the mountains and the farm animals. It is a true paradise for any shy/semi-feral cat! As Jen says, the cats can stay in the Inn as long as they like, they can transition to their massive, newly-built barn, or even get adopted — it's up to the kitties. We could not be more thrilled at the opportunities that this partnership brings — and how many more cats both organizations will be able to help for years to come.

On June 23rd, our beautiful girls, Bobina and Fig, became the very first residents of the Black Cat Inn. We packed up their bags with their favorite beds, toys, and

blankets, and hit the road for a three-hour road trip to the Farm. It was a very long day for them, but the move went smoothly and they handled it like little champs. Jen has reported that the girls are doing really well. Within 24 hours of their arrival, they both ventured out of their cubbies, exploring their new home and trying out the many perches and cat trees in the Inn. That's pretty amazing. It's clear that they feel the peace and kindness that surrounds Tomten Farm.


SPONSOR-A-CAT/ SPONSOR-A-ROOM PROGRAM


